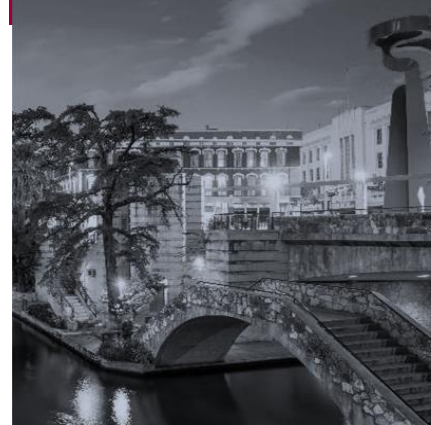

Increased food and resource insecurity	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Neighborhood – based access to food and commodities Navigation services to coordinate access to resources across providers and services for home bound seniors Enrollment assistance for public benefits Direct financial assistance to stabilize seniors in crisis 	Help ease increased cost and scarcity of resources for older adults with financial constraints	\$2 Million
