



Chapter 252.043 limits use of CSP on vertical (facility/park) projects at any value & horizontal (street/drainage) projects valued at \$1.5M or less.

Summary of Action Taken


On September 6, 2018, City **Council** authorized Amendment to 2007 Ordinance authorizing the use of CSP for roadway and drainage projects exceed \$1.5M and meet certain criteria.

CSP Criteria

(Street & Drainage Projects)

- Located along major corridor
- Multimodal transportation uses
- Within tourist, historic, downtown and business districts
- High impact to stakeholders
- Critical timeline
- Complex scope
- Constrained work spaces

Chapter 252.043 allows City Council to authorize use of alternative delivery method if it provides a better value.

- Communication procedures to the public by TCI CPO's is inconsistent
- Sometimes information that is shared with public about projects are incorrect
- Difficult for residents to contact TCI regarding projects.
- Complete communication failure with residents is rare.



- Make ALL TCI public communications with residents consistent
- Make TCI public communications with residents more effective
- Help public better understand how their lives will be impacted by TCI projects

Project Communication Plans

Vertical

- Stakeholders must be notified at least four weeks prior to public meeting dates.
- A public meeting(s) must be held during design in coordination with the client department.
- Project signage must be placed in a visible location prior to and for the duration of construction.
- If the project scope or timeline changes, an updated notice must be promptly sent to stakeholders.

Additional Options

- Create a project webpage on the TCI website.
- E-mail blasts regarding the project status should be sent to stakeholders weekly or bi-weekly.
- Project Manager or other TCI representative may meet in person with area stakeholders to provide updates and address concerns.

IMP

- Send approved notification letter* to stakeholders a week prior to the project beginning.
- Project signage must be placed in a visible location at IMP projects that affect the right of way.
- If the project scope or timeline changes, an updated notice must be promptly sent to stakeholders.

*Contact Public Relations if a notification letter is not available

IMP Projects Lasting Over Two Months applies to projects planned to last or unexpectedly lasting over two months

- Hold a public meeting before any construction begins or as soon as the timeline changes.
- Capital Project Officers will meet with area stakeholders to provide updates and address concerns.
- E-mail blasts regarding the project status must be sent to stakeholders weekly or bi-weekly.

Additional Options

On-line schedule for program projects on the TCI website.

Horizontal

applies to projects lasting two months or longer

- Stake Iders must be notified at least two weeks prior to public meeting dates.
- A public meeting must be held when 40% of design is complete.
- Another public meeting must be held before any construction.
- Project signage must be placed in a visible location prior to and for the duration of construction.
- Capital Project Officers will meet with area stakeholders to provide updates and address concerns.
- E-mail blasts regarding the project status must be sent to stakeholders weekly or bi-weekly.
- If the project scope or timeline changes, an updated notice must be promptly sent to stakeholders.

Additional Options

- A public meeting can be hosted when 70% or 95% of design is complete if needed.
- Create a project webpage on the TCI website
- Hold progress meeting during construction.

Consult appropriate TCI Assistant Director if considering eliminating steps above.

All downtown projects must be coordinated with Edward Mery (TCI) and the Center City Development & Operations Department.

Project Communication Plans

Neighborhood Access Mobility Program (NAMP)

Sidewalks, ADA Ramps, School Flashing Beacons & Curbs

- Memo requesting project work is drafted by the Council liaison and is signed by the respective Council Member.
- Project Manager receives the approved notification letter with the project locations entered by the contractor, then reviews and approves it for distribution.
- If an approved notification letter is not available, one can be developed by the TCI Public Relations Team.
- The approved notification letter must be delivered to stakeholders two weeks prior to the project beginning.
- If the project scope or timeline changes, an updated notice must be promptly sent to stakeholders.

Speed Humps

- Request for speed numps is received and reviewed.
- If proposed location is eligible, the Council District is notified and a cost estimate is provided to them.
- If the Council District funds the project, staff must then canvass the neighborhood of the proposed location to obtain a 2/3 approval from residents.
- The speed hump requestor must be notified whether the request is approved or not approved through the 2/3 canvassing process.
- If 2/3 approval is received, the installation of the speed humps must be scheduled.
- The speed hump requestor must be provided with a timeline of when the speed humps will be installed.




