

WHO WE ARE:

ECAG (Eastside Christian Action Group), A 501-C-3 - Church sponsored Community Group and the organization that created, developed and manages Wheatley Heights Sports Complex (**WHSC**)

• DEFINE PROJECT SCOPE/COST/TIMELINE:

WHSC was built 10 years ago with quality original equipment and surfaces which now exceed life span and in need of replacement. <u>REQUEST TOTAL FUNDING OF \$1,500,000</u>:

- FOOTBALL SYNTHETIC TURF FIELD (remove & replace w/same product)/\$500,000/2 year
- 8 LANE SYNTHETIC TRACK (remove & replace w/same product)/\$350,000/2 year
- RE-FURBISH PUBLIC TOILET ROOMS (remove & replace w/same product)/\$150,000/3 years
- UPGRADE ELECTRONIC SCOREBOARD (same product)/\$250,000/3 years
- INSTALL LIGHTS ON PRACTICE FIELDS (same product used on stadium)/\$150,000/3 years
- RE-FURBISH ELECTRONIC SYSTEMS IN STADIUM FIELD & (replace)/\$100,000/3 years

• BENEFIT TO THE PUBLIC:

WHSC has been in operation since 2012 providing outdoor sports facility accommodations for youth and adult sports hosting: Regional Bike-a-thons, State-wide Run/Walk-a-thons, Youth & High School Football Games & Regional Play-offs, Youth Soccer Games/Tournaments, Adult Rugby Games/Tournaments, High School & AAU Youth Track & Field Regional & Area Meets/Events







Mission Statement

The mission of the National Audubon Society is to protect birds and the places they need, today and tomorrow. Audubon works throughout the Americas using science, advocacy, education, and on-the-ground conservation.

The Mitchell Lake Audubon Center connects people to nature through conservation and community education focused on birds and their habitat.



Mitchell Lake Site Facts

- 1,200 acres: 600-acre Mitchell Lake and 600 acres of wetlands & ponds, uplands, grasslands, and woodlands.
- Known as Laguna de los Patos: Missions used Mitchell Lake to water cattle.
- Purchased in 1963 by the City of San Antonio. SAWS assumed responsibility in 1992.
- National Audubon Society began management in 2004.
- 12,000 visitors and 4,000 students served annually; 70% of schools Title I.
- 330+ bird species observed, the most of any Audubon Center in US.

The Vision: A Southside public park unlike any other!



Two-phase project will transform 1,700+ contiguous acres into world-class recreational area, education center, and eco-tourist destination.

Phase 1

\$12M in bond-funded park improvements would enhance visitor experience and increase public access to Mitchell Lake.

Leveraged by \$420K per year in programmatic and operational support from Audubon with ability to drive new programs and leverage investments from public and private sector donations and grants.

Phase 2 (2024)

\$72M leveraged to modify existing dam, add 400 acres of land incl. 83 acres of treatment wetlands, and create additional public access to Medina River.



Benefits: A Southside Gem is a City-wide Win





Public Health & Safety

- Nature-based infrastructure and health benefits on a developing Southside.
- Restored wetlands provide surface water treatment.
- Immersive nature park with 7 miles of trails to promotes health and psychological well-being.

Equity

- Will be a FREE public park space.
- An area of San Antonio that has been historically under-resourced.
- The "Phill Hardberger" Park for the South side.

Resilience

- Supports SA Climate Ready Climate Action and Adaptation Plan
- Promotes biodiversity and supporting populations of diverse plants and animals
- Provides ecosystem services to reduce the impact of urban heat island, captures stormwater, and to sequesters carbon.

Connectivity

- On San Antonio's thriving hike and bike trail system; will connect to numerous destinations in the City
- Access from future Kelly Parkway
- K-12 programs, university student internships, student research opportunities
- International birding location on worldrenowned Central Flyway


Mitchell Lake can be the crown jewel in an historical and recreational necklace that will connect the many tourist destinations and natural resources of San Antonio.

Espada Land Tract





- TJX (TJMaxx) to <u>donate</u> 380 acres (304 in FEMA floodplain) to a joint venture of TAMU-SA and SARA, in District 3
- Located just south of Mission Espada bordered on the east by the San Antonio River
- Opportunity to strike a geographical balance to the investment COSA and Bexar County have made in open spaces over recent decades at McAllister Park, Hardberger Park, Government Canyon and other public spaces.



Guiding Principles for 2022 Bond:

- Connectivity Promotes citywide greenspace and establishes a destination in SA that feeds our economic development story and extension of the missions heritage theme
- Public Health and Safety Enhance public health, wellness and safe connectivity to community destinations, promote sustainable green infrastructure

San Antonio Arboretum

Request funding from 2022 Bond: \$1.5M to support:

- Strategic planning
- Pre-development design

Original request was \$7M

Leveraged Funding:

- Bexar County has allocated \$7.4M of bond funding toward Arboretum (mostly access roads)
- FoSAA will focus on private donations/Foundation alignment (1H2022)
- Pursue ARPA and other State and Fed programs/grants

Land is part of an agreement with a private entity and San Antonio River Authority/Texas A&M University - San Antonio and will be transferred over in the next 30-45 days.

Cost and overall timeline is the output of Strategic Planning
