Any person who does not speak English well has the right, under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act, to interpretation assistance in their own language free of charge. This card will help service providers to identify a person's language before calling for an interpreter.

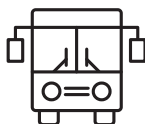

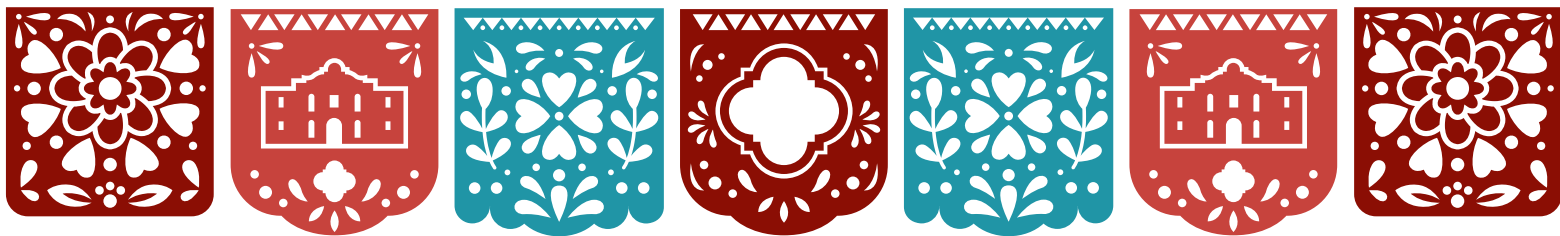
