



Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)

BETWEEN

Saint Louis University
Baguio City, Philippines

AND

The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio
San Antonio, Texas, United States of America

The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio (hereafter known as "UTHSCSA") and Saint Louis University (hereafter known as "[SLU]"), wishing to establish cooperative relations between the two institutions, especially in the development of academic and cultural interchanges and other areas of mutual interest, agree to encourage direct contact and cooperation between their faculty, students, and research staff.

In order to encourage this interaction, SLU and the UTHSCSA agree to the following general forms of cooperation:

- Non-degree academic study, including student exchange and specially designed study abroad programs;
- Visits by and interchange of staff and/or faculty for research and teaching;
- Collaborative research activities, including grant-writing;
- Exchange of non-proprietary information which includes, but is not limited to, the exchange of library resources and research publications;
- Curriculum development; and
- Collaboration with Continuing Education and other training programs.

The parties understand and agree that there must be a subsidiary written agreement for each particular program or project noted above. The parties also agree that:

- The movement of students shall be subject to legislation in force in each country and be in accordance with the by-laws, rules, and regulations of the two institutions;
- Both parties understand that all financial arrangements must be negotiated and agreed upon in advance, with due regard to the availability and use of funds and other resources;
- Specific details for the implementation of the activities listed herein will be developed mutually and prior to the implementation of any cooperative programs or projects; and
- The Agreement shall not bind either party to a financial obligation or commitment.

The duration of this MOU shall be five (5) years from the date of final signature. If the MOU remains dormant, (i.e. there is no collaboration or student, staff, or faculty exchange for five (5) consecutive years), it will be deemed to have lapsed. Where it continues to be active, the two institutions shall review the agreement six (6) months prior to the expiration date. If the parties concur, then the general agreement shall be extended in writing for such period as may be agreed upon.

This MOU may be terminated at any time by mutual written consent by either of the two parties with due regard given to other contractual commitments in terms of specific plans or activities that may be related to a subsidiary agreement(s).
