


INTRODUCTION

San Pedro Springs Park, the oldest park in Texas, is a historic site centered around the San Pedro Springs. This 46-acre park offers the community opportunities for recreation, access to nature, and a connection to our city's rich history. The historic San Pedro Playhouse, McFarlin Tennis Center and San Antonio's first library, San Pedro Branch Library, are all located within the park, further enriching the offerings of this beloved park.

In 2022, San Antonio committed to investing \$1.75 million dollars into San Pedro Springs Park through the bond and in 2023, the City Council District 1 office under Councilwoman Kaur, committed an additional \$1.75 million to support the revitalization of the park.

Supporting City of San Antonio's Parks & Recreation Department and District 1 City Council, Blooming with Birdie and the Impact Guild developed a thoughtful and engaged public input process to activate key stakeholders and community members to take an active role by providing feedback on the future of the park.

Blooming with Birdie and the Impact Guild developed the strategy, design and implementation in alignment with the following Project Goals:

Manage and support a thoughtful and engaged public input process that activates key stakeholders and community members to:

- Engage with the history, relevancy & culture of San Pedro Springs Park
- Inform 2022 Bond Project Priorities
- Take an active role in the future of the park including preliminary research on a San Pedro Springs Conservancy, continued programming, & financial sustainability

The following report is a summary of the community engagement process, key findings and recommendations, and data collected.





EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The community engagement process for San Pedro Springs Park unfolded over nine months, beginning with foundational research on the park's history, best practices for local conservancies, and preliminary stakeholder interviews.

Inspired by insights from these stakeholder meetings, the Sueños Campaign adopted two primary strategies for gathering community feedback, concluding with a final event that allowed for higher-level input. Feedback was collected through three main mechanisms:

1. SA SpeakUp Community Survey

This highly accessible digital survey, available in English and Spanish, reached the community through targeted email and text campaigns, along with park signage and flyers, to ensure broad awareness and participation.

2. Sueños of San Pedro Springs Park Game

This interactive "game" allowed participants to envision and "build" their ideal version of the park while providing feedback on current bond spending and their future aspirations for the space. Engagement for the game took place at park activations and local neighborhood meetings, offering a hands-on, creative way for participants to share their perspectives while learning more about the park.



3. Sueños Event & Level 2 Feedback

The campaign culminated in a community event that served as a final opportunity for feedback. This event was structured around initial findings from both the survey and the Sueños game, enabling a second layer of more detailed feedback on bond allocations and future improvements.






How frequently do you visit San Pedro Springs Park?










TOP 10 RANKED DESIGN FEATURES SA Speak Up Community Survey




LEVEL TWO DATA

Additional feedback was gathered during facilitation of the Sueños Game, in community interactions, and during targeted outreach based on the community survey. This feedback was synthesized in June and informed Level 2 Data that was then collected during the Sueños Event. An average of 244 people voted on each of the following 9 features using Voting Feedback Boards:

The need for wayfinding signage to highlight historical significance, key points. of interest, and "see something, say something" safety signage was inspired by the initial stakeholder meeting and then confirmed anecdotally throughout the community engagement process.



POOL

 As the Springs have drawn people to this place for 1000s of years, it is recommended to continue to invest in water as a priority design feature and draw for the community.

DESIGN PRIORITIES

1. Shaded Seating:

Umbrellas, Chairs, Tables (moveable)

2. Splash Pad

Near the pool

3. Food & Beverage Concessions

Near the pool

LOCATION

- Food concessions & splash pad in proximity to one another and to the pool
- Per conversations with the Parks & Rec Dept, it is recommended that fences or other barriers are used to maintain separation of food from the pool area as necessary.

OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

- Restrooms: As the 3rd ranked design feature, updates to restrooms in proximity to the pool are recommended.
- History: Consider ways to incorporate history into design such as acequias in splash pad design and/or use of Alamo Bandstand or Swan Houses in concession design.







- Community preference:
 - Parkour Generation via the community expressed that this type of "explorable spaces that are unscripted promotes creativity and play and personal development; a space designed for people of all ages to interact with."

ADDITIONAL FEEDBACK

Additional feedback was collected throughout the engagement process, including during the Sueños Game facilitation, community interactions, and targeted outreach following the community survey. This input shaped Level 2 data analysis and informed subsequent recommendations. Below are the most frequently shared comments and how they were integrated into the feedback process.

What is happening with the trees? How can we save them?

The community expressed care for the trees as a clear priority and shared a desire for irrigation, removal of dead trees, and new trees to be planted.

Water as a theme:

The community expressed interest in restoring the natural springs

- Result: Worked with Edwards Aquifer to explore options
- Result: Potential use for acequias?
 Concept added to Level 2 data collection

What kind of playscape?

The Parkour Community responded to the community survey and shared their desire for opportunities for a parkour friendly playscape

- Result: Invited to participate in Sueños Event
- **Result**: Preference for type of playscape added to Level 2 data collection
- Result: Idea to create a Nature Playscape to repurpose trees, demonstrated at Sueños event



Participant's Frequency of Park Visits






