



# Economic Development Budget History (\$ in Millions)




### FY 2026 Proposed Budget:\$18.6 Million



# FY 2026 Reductions: \$2.6 Million 14

#### Reductions

- Eliminate Construction Mitigation Grants: \$1.4 Million
- Right-size Construction Mitigation Program: \$150,000
- Restructure greater:SATX Agreement: \$70,000
- Align Workforce Development Funds into Ready to Work: \$247,052
- Reduce 2 Vacant Positions: \$293,794
- Additional adjustments: \$444,021

### **Zero Percent Interest Rate Loan Program:** \$500,000

- Assists small businesses to strengthen financial standing, build credit, and grow their business
- FY 2024 and FY 2025 Program leveraged ARPA,
   General Fund, and matching resources
- \$2M investment: \$1M in FY 2024 & \$1M FY 2025
- FY 2025 Results: \$2.5M in capital disbursed through 91 loans as of July 31, 2025
- FY 2026 Target: 26 Loans and \$1M in capital





RevitalizeSA: Corridor Leadership Program: \$250,000

- Cultivates community leaders to revitalize and grow local commercial corridors.
- 2-year pilot program leveraged \$1M in ARPA resources
- FY 2024/2025 Results:
  - Cohort participants: 32
  - Corridor projects: 22 (10 in progress)
- FY 2026 Target:
  - 15 participants
