This correspondence transmits the results of the Governance Committee meeting held today regarding the fund balances from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF).

Background:

On February 2, 2023 the City Council approved contract awards in the amount of \$36.40 million to 59 agencies recommended from a competitive process for Mental Health Services, Non-Profit Social Services, Senior Services, and Youth Services. A balance of \$3.75 million was unallocated from this competitive process and the City Council directed this balance to the Governance Committee for discussion.

The table below reflects the funds approved at the February 2nd City Council meeting and unallocated amount for each category.

Additionally, on February 8, 2023 the City Council was provided an update on the COVID-19 Recovery & Resiliency Plan and ARPA SLFRF Program. At this presentation, the City Council was made aware that \$3.9 million was available to be allocated from interest income and program balances. The City Council directed this balance to also be discussed at the February 15 Governance Committee meeting.

Staff Recommendation:

At today's Governance Committee Meeting, City Staff made the following recommendations for the Committee's consideration:

• \$3.7 million balance from competitive process for mental health, youth and seniors be sent back to the respective committees that developed the implementation plans for further discussion.

- \$3.9 million in available funds from ARPA SLFRF interest income and program balances be used for:
 - o \$2,403,896 for Non-Profit social agencies with strong applications who were not awarded for lack of funds.
 - Nine non-profit social agencies with a score of 70 or more were recommended to receive 50% of their application with contracts being considered by the City Council at an "A" Session in March 2023.
 - o \$1,498,462 for COVID-19 Construction Grants for Small Businesses
 - Funds to be added to on-going application process with notification to City Council via memo

Governance Committee Actions Taken

After discussion and consideration of the Staff recommendations, the Governance Committee took the following actions:

- A) \$3,749,741 balance from competitive process for mental health, youth and seniors sent back to the respective committees who developed the implementation plans for further discussion with an amendment that moved the balance in the Youth Category to the CHEC Committee.
- B) \$2,403,896 balance recommended for Non-Profit Agencies was amended to be divided equally and sent to the Public Safety and CHEC Committees.

The table below reflects these two actions. The recommendations from the Committees will be presented to the City Council for consideration once their work is completed.

C) \$1,498,462 for COVID-19 Construction Grants for Small Businesses was approved to be added to the on-going application process that opened this past Monday February 13.

The actions taken today by the Governance Committee officially closed the competitive solicitation process for Mental Health, Youth, Seniors, and Non-Profits. Applications from this process will not be considered for future allocations.

A new solicitation process will open once the Public Safety and CHEC committees complete their work.
